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From the true point for the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30.

N. 0°04.4' E., bet. secs. 19 and 24.

Over mountainous land, through scattered creosote brush and  
Brigham tea.

0.540 The witness cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, monumented with an  
iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above the  
ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of  
T. 18 S., R. 63 E., executed under Group No. 159. Add the marks  
1992 to the cap.

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N. 0°04.4' E., beginning new measurement.

39.058 The witness  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 24, monumented with an  
iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with  
brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 18 S.,  
R. 63 E., executed under Group No. 159. Remark the cap to read
