	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>GENERAL DESCRIPTION</b></p> <p>The area resurveyed within Township 18 South, Range 63 East, varies from mountainous in the southeastern portion to rolling in the central portion with the remaining terrain being gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 2,100 to 2,500 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay, gravelly and rocky. The vegetation consists of creosote brush, Brigham tea and cacti. The Union Pacific Railroad and Interstate Highway No. 15 crosses north northeasterly through sections 13 and 24. U.S. Highway No. 93 enters on the west boundary of section 13 and junctions into Interstate Highway No. 15. Other access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved desert trail roads.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
