DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE EAST BOUNDARY,
T. 37 N., R. 52 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
A. J. Hatch and J. H. Eaton, U.S. Deputy Surveyors,
in 1871

The original corners were established for Rs. 52 and 53 E., but now these corners will refer to R. 52 E. only.

From the cor. of Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 52 and 53 E., monumented with a quartzite stone, 16X6X6 ins., dimly mkd. with 6 notches on N. edge, 3 notches on W. edge and no other marks visible, firmly set in an embedded mound of stone. This cor. now refers to Tps. 36 and 37 N., Rs. 52 E. only.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 19 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Deposit the original cornerstone alongside the stainless steel post.

N. 0° 50' E., on the E. bdy. of sec. 36.

Over rolling mountainous land, through scattered sagebrush, serviceberry, rabbitbrush and native grass.

- 4.38 The closing cor. of sec. 36, T. 37 N., R. 52 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., hereinafter described.
- 10.60 Ravine, drains WNW.
- 39.79 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. This cor. now refers to sec. 36 only.
