CHAINS

Point for the W ¹/₄ sec. cor. of sec. 12, is WEST of the E ¹/₄ sec. cor. of sec. 12, and on the E. bdy. of sec. 12, T. 37 N., R. 52 E.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2¹/₂ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land within the confines of this survey in Township 37 North, Range 52¹/₂ East, located approximately 30 miles north-northwest of Elko, Nevada, is rolling mountainous terrain at about 6200 ft. in elevation. There are several washes in the area, draining westerly toward Maggie Creek. The soil is generally sandy clay loam with rocks. The vegetation consists of scattered sagebrush, serviceberry, rabbitbrush and native grass.

Access is gained from Elko via Nevada State Highway No. 225, then westerly along trail roads, or from Carlin via Maggie Creek. There is only a couple of trail roads accessing this specific area.

Principal users of the area are ranchers.
