TOWNSHIP 40 NORTH, RANGE 65 EAST, MDM, NEVADA CHAINS GENERAL DESCRIPTION The land within Township 40 North, Range 65 East, ranges from about 5,500 to 6,500 ft. above sea level, the eastern one-half of the township is nearly level to rolling, the western one-half lies in the Windermere Hills. The soil varies from sandy clay, gravelly and rocky on the higher elevations to sandy clay and loam on the bottom land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, whitesage, rabbitbrush, greasewood, native grass and crested wheatgrass. There is scattered to heavy juniper on the higher elevations of little commercial value. The township is drained by Toano Draw, which drains north-northwest through the eastern portion of the township and numerous other dry washes throughout the area. There are two buildings in section 31. Toano Well No. 1 is located in section 24 and Indian Spring in section 6. Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by improved and unimproved desert trail roads. No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.
