<p>39.421</p>	<p>The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, monumented with a galvanized iron pipe, 2 ins. diam., firmly set 14 ins. below the surface, with iron cap mkd. USCE 1/4 S1 S36 1951. Although no record could be found, this appears to be a corner monument set by the U.S. Corps of Engineers and is accepted as a careful and faithful reestablishment of the position of the original corner. Add the marks BLM 1992 to the iron cap.</p>

<p>Over rolling land.</p>	
<p>39.422</p>	<p>The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, remonumented by Nelson E. Meyer, Nevada Professional Land Surveyor No. 1871, monumented with an iron rebar, 3/8 in. diam., firmly set flush with the ground, with a brass cap mkd. T19S T20S 1 2 35 36 as recorded in Clark County, Nevada, File 41 Page 54 of Surveys. This iron rebar is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner. Add the marks BLM 1992 to the brass cap.</p>
<p>The rebar is concreted into the base of a corner post of a chainlink fence, bears N. and W.</p>
