East from the standard cor. of Tps. 16 N., Rs. 33 and 33$\frac{1}{2}$ E.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker and in a collar of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">SE-COR LVNBR-17 S 32</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1991</p> <p>From this corner, the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, hereinbefore described, bears WEST, 14.91 chs. dist.</p> <p>N. 0°03' E., on the Lahontan Valley Navy Bombing Range Boundary.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, through scattered undergrowth.</p>

27.00	Top of cliff, bears E. and W.
32.20	Spur, slopes W.

	<p>Point for a witness point on the easterly bdy. of the Lahontan Valley Navy Bombing Range.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2$\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">WP S 29 S 32</p> <p style="text-align: center;">1991</p> <p>Set a steel fence post, 5$\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p> <p>From this corner, the cor. of secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32, hereinbefore described, bears S. 89°59' W., 15.04 chs. dist.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, sandy clay and rocky. Undergrowth, sagebrush, Brigham tea and native grass.</p> <hr/> <p>N. 0°03' E., on the Lahontan Valley Navy Bombing Range Boundary.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, through scattered undergrowth.</p>
