	<p>From this corner, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 5, T. 28 N., R. 58 E., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set projecting 4 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 28 N., R. 58 E., executed under Group No. 191, bears S. $0^{\circ}36'30''$ W., 40.285 chs. dist. Add the marks T28N R58E 1993 to the brass cap.</p>
	<p>West, bet. secs. 5 and 32.</p>
	<p>Over mountainous land, covered with medium sagebrush, native grass, scattered quaking aspen, and mountain mahogany.</p>
4.00	<p>Power line, bears N. $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E. and S. $5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.</p>
20.00	<p>Point for the E $\frac{1}{16}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 32, determined at record bearing and distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p>
	<p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.</p>

	<p>Set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p>

	<p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 3 ins. below the surface of the ground, over a DEEP-1 magnetic marker, with brass cap mkd.</p>
