

SURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE SUBDIVISIONAL LINES,

Set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.

From this corner, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, T. 28 N., R. 47 E., monumented with an aluminum post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set projecting 3 ins. above the ground, with aluminum cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the south boundary of T. 28 N., R. 47 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears S. $89^{\circ}02'20''$ E., 13.981 chs. dist.

The point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 6 only, is on the S. bdy. of sec. 31, T. 28 N., R. 47 E. and at 40.00 chains in departure from the closing corner of secs. 5 and 6.

POINT NOT MONUMENTED

From this point, the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 28 N., R. 47 E., monumented with a stainless steel post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set projecting 4 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the south boundary of T. 28 N., R. 47 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears N. $79^{\circ}28'00''$ W., 0.473 chs. dist.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land surveyed within Township 27 North, Range 47 East, is situated about 14 miles SSW. of Crescent Valley, Nevada. The first half mile surveyed between sections 33 and 34 is mountainous and about 5,700 ft. above sea level with the remaining being nearly level and averaging about 4,850 ft. above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam and vegetation consists of sagebrush and native grass.

Access into the area is provided by Nevada State Route No. 306 and numerous improved gravel and secondary trail roads. The Cortez Gold Mining haulage road crosses the area from NW. to SE. entering in section 6 and leaving in section 9.

There has been extensive mining activity throughout the area. In addition to the mining activity, principal users of the area are cattlemen.
