RM T28N R46E S1 5.02 FT. 1994 and an arrow pointing to the cor.

A stainless steel post, 28 ins. long,  $2^{1}/_{2}$  ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock, over a plastic incased magnet and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, for a reference monument, bears N. 31°15′ W., 5.02 ft. dist., with brass cap mkd. RM T29N R47E S36 5.02 FT. 1994 and an arrow pointing to the cor.

This control line was fully retraced and careful search was made for evidence of intervening corners, none of which were recovered.
