	From Cor. No. 2, Milepost 11, monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set flush with the surface of the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1931 survey, and a mound of stone NE of the cor. N. 0°01'00" W., on mile 12.
27.105	The closing cor. of secs. 14 and 23, hereinbefore described.
35.109	Intersect the easterly right-of-way line of old U.S. Highway No. 95, bears N. 10°02'40" E. and S. 10°02'40" W. From this point a highway right-of-way monument, an iron pin in a concrete block, 6 ins. square, bears N. 10°02'40" E., 32.744 chs. dist.
39.995	Milepost 11 $\frac{1}{2}$, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1931 survey, and a mound of stone east of the cor. N. 0°01'00" W., beginning new measurement.
27.517	Intersect the E-W center line of sec. 14.
40.004	Milepost 12, monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set projecting 6 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1931 survey, and a mound of stone east of the cor. N. 0°01'10" W., on mile 13.
27.888	The closing cor. of secs. 11 and 14, hereinbefore described.
39.991	Milepost 12 $\frac{1}{2}$, monumented with an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1931 survey, and a mound of stone east of the cor.
