<p>Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by H.B. Maxson, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in 1894</p> <hr/>	
<p>From the cor. of Tps. 40 N., Rs. 64 and 65 E., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2<math>\frac{1}{2}</math> ins. diam., firmly set showing 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 40 N., R. 65 E., executed under Group No. 673.</p> <p>From this corner, a fragmented limestone, 14 x 9 x 8 ins. (largest remaining piece), mkd. with some notches on two edges, with an iron pipe, 2<math>\frac{1}{2}</math> ins. diam., 3 ft. long, flattened on both ends, lying alongside, bears N. 20°44' W., 9.52 chs. dist. The marked stone is fragmented and the iron pipe is out of the ground due to bulldozer construction in this area. This position was monumented under rejected Contract No. 175.</p> <p>N. 89°30' W., on the S. bdy. of sec. 36.</p> <p>Over rolling land, covered with dense juniper and scattered sagebrush.</p>	
<p>3.05</p>	<p>The cor. of Tps. 39 N., Rs. 64 and 65 E., bears NORTH, 0.55 chs. dist., monumented with a redwood post, 3 x 2 ins., 24 ins. long, mkd. R64E S1 and 6 grooves on W. face, R65E S6 and 6 grooves on E. face, wired to a steel fence post, firmly set showing 4 ft. above ground.</p>
