

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY,

The cor. of Tps. 41 and 42 N., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monumented with a juniper post, 2 ins. square, 15 ins. long, with illegible scribe marks visible, firmly set alongside a steel fence post.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.

Reset the original wooden post and steel fence post alongside the stainless steel post.

From this corner, U.S.C. & G.S. triangulation station "RED POINT", monumented with a standard brass tablet set in the top of a concrete monument, 6 ins. diam., exposed 4 ins. above the ground, with brass tablet mkd. RED POINT 1940, bears N.  $42^{\circ}59'30''$  W., (mean bearing) 73.79 chs. dist.

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Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by A. J. Hatch and

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From the standard cor. of Tps. 41 N., Rs. 63 and 64 E., monumented with a stainless steel post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., firmly set and exposed 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 40 N., R. 64 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.

N.  $0^{\circ}48'$  E., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling reseeded land, through scattered sagebrush and crested wheatgrass.

Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
