TOWNSHIP 41 NORTH, RANGE 64 EAST, MDM. NEVADA

39.75	<p>N. 0°59' E., bet. secs. 5 and 6.</p> <p>Over rolling land, through scattered sagebrush and native grass.</p> <p>The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6, monumented with a juniper post, 1 in. square, 30 ins. long, with illegible scribe marks visible, loosely set in a mound of earth.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T41N R64E S $\frac{1}{4}$ 6 S 5 1989</p> <p>Reset the original wooden post and set a steel fence post, $5\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p>

	<p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed within Township 41 North, Range 64 East, varies from nearly level, rolling to mountainous land. The elevation ranges from about 5,500 to 6,700 ft. above sea level. The soil varies from sandy clay, gravelly and rocky on the higher elevations to black loam on the bottom land. The vegetation consists of sagebrush, rabbitbrush, greasewood, and crested wheatgrass. There are scattered stands of willows along the Thousand Springs Creek which crosses the township in an easterly course.</p> <p>Principal users of the area are cattlemen and access into the township is provided by numerous improved and unimproved desert trail roads.</p> <p>No mineral formations of consequence were noted during the survey.</p>
