T. 25 S., R. 59 E., MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

	<p>From this corner, U. S. C. & G. S. bench mark, monumented with a standard brass tablet mkd. "K-146 1958", firmly set in concrete block, 8 ins. square, set flush with the ground, bears N. 37°32' W., 22.50 chs. dist.</p> <hr/> <p>N. 0°15.5' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.</p> <p>Over gently rolling land, covered with scattered creosote brush, yuccas, various cacti and native grass.</p>
7.10	Underground petroleum pipeline, bears N. 22 ³ / ₄ ° E. and S. 22 ³ / ₄ ° W.
9.40	Improved gravel road, bears WNW. and ESE.
25.60	Trail road, bears WSW. and ESE.
39.528	<p>Point for the ¹/₄ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2¹/₂ ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T25S R59E R60E ¹/₄ S 1 S 6 1992</p> </div> <p>Set a fiberglass post, 5 ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post.</p>
39.90	Underground telecommunication cable, parallels State Route No. 604.
44.80	State Route No. 604, bears N. 31° E. and S. 31° W.
57.60	Trail road, bears NW. and SE.
77.05	Intersect I-15 right-of-way, fence, bears N. 30°53' E. and S. 30°53' W.
81.269	<p>The closing cor. of Tps. 25 S., Rs. 59 and 60 E., determined by Joseph P. Fielding, Nevada Professional Land Surveyor No. 6199, monumented with a rebar, ⁵/₈ in. diam., 18 ins. long, set flush with the ground, with an aluminum cap, 2 ins. diam., mkd. "NEVADA POWER COMPANY RLS 6199 CC" and an unmarked limestone, 24x19x10 ins., lying alongside. This rebar is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner. Add the marks "AM BLM 1992" to the aluminum cap and bury the unmarked stone alongside the rebar.</p>
81.331	<p>Intersect the Sixth Standard Parallel South.</p> <p>Point for the closing cor. of Tps. 25 S., Rs. 59 and 60 E.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2¹/₂ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p>
