

## TOWNSHIP 12 NORTH, RANGE 42 EAST, MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The portion of the township that was resurveyed or subdivided is located about five miles northerly of Carvers, Nevada on the west side of Nevada State Route No. 376 in the eastern foothills of the Toiyabe Mountains. The elevation varies from 5700 to 6300 feet above sea level. The terrain is rolling to mountainous with many rock covered areas. There are numerous sources of water coming out of the canyons located west of the surveyed parts of the township that are diverted to irrigation users with the result that the North and South Twin Rivers are void of water shortly after leaving the narrow parts of their canyons. The soil is predominately clay. Vegetation for the most part consists of cacti, sagebrush, bitter brush, rabbitbrush, Brigham tea, shadscale and native grasses. Willows are found along the water courses with scattered junipers and pinon pine.

Access is provided by several improved gravel roads and numerous trail roads taking off from Nevada State Route No. 386. A state gravel pit is located in the eastern part of section 12. Jim Ike's abandoned house is found in the northeast quarter of section 10. Principal users of the area are recreationists, ranchers and miners.

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
