Voigt, U.S. Cadastral Engineer, in 1918-21</p> <hr/> <p>From the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 32, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 40 N., R. 23 E., executed under Group No. 48.</p> <p>Remark the brass cap to read as follows:</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> SC T41N R23E <u>1/4 S32</u> 1919 1989 </div> <p>S. $86^{\circ}36'10''$ W., on the S. bdy. of sec. 32.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, covered with medium sagebrush, scattered rabbitbrush and native grass.</p> <p>27.162 The closing cor. of Tps. 40 N., Rs. $22\frac{1}{2}$ and 23 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 40 N., R. 23 E., executed under Group No. 48.</p> <p>37.434 Point selected for the witness cor. to the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> WC SC T41N R23E S31 S32 ←————— </div> <p style="text-align: center;">1989</p> <p>Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, N. of cor.</p> <p>From this corner, U.S.C. & G.S. Benchmark "K 66 1934", monumented with a standard brass disk stamped "K 66 1934", firmly cemented in top of a large boulder, bears N. $29^{\circ}26'00''$ W., 16.488 chs. dist.</p> <p>38.434 Point for the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32, determined by irregular boundary adjustment; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner or the witness cor. set in 1919. Point falls in creek in High Rock Canyon, 30 lks. wide, 6 ft. deep, course S., where it is impracticable to establish a permanent monument.</p> <hr/> <p>N. $89^{\circ}53'10''$ W., on the S. bdy. of sec. 31.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, covered with medium sagebrush, scattered rabbitbrush and native grass.</p>
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
