<p>CHAINS 40.226</p>	<p>The cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12, monumented with an unmarked volcanic stone, 16x10x7 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, previously described in the field notes of T. 42 N., R. 23 E., executed under Group No. 101. This cor. will now refer to the cor. of secs. 1 and 12 only.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T41N R23E R23 1/2E S 1 ----- S12 </p> </div> <p>1989</p> <p>Deposit the unmarked stone and set a steel fence post, 5½ ft. long, alongside the stainless steel post, and rebuild the mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.</p>
<p>39.164</p>	<p>N. 1°07'40" E., on the E. bdy. of sec. 1.</p> <p>Over rolling land, covered with medium sagebrush.</p> <p>Point for the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. This cor. will now refer to the ¼ sec. cor. of sec. 1 only.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T41N R23E R23 1/2E 1/4 S 1 </p> </div> <p>1989</p>
