	<p>The vertical angles of measurements made on the slope were ascertained with a theodolite in good adjustment; the horizontal equivalents only are entered in the field notes.</p> <p>The geographic position for the cor. of secs. 18 and 19, T. 39 N., R. 27 E., is at Lat. 41°16'32.7" N. and Long. 118°56'57.2" W. - NAD 83 (1986), as calculated along section lines from a direct tie to U. S. C. & G. Transitmen, in 1910</p> <hr/> <p>From the cor. of secs. 18 and 19, T. 39 N., R. 27 E., monumented with a stainless steel post, 2¹/₂ ins. diam., firmly set showing 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 39 N., R. 27 E., executed concurrently under this same Group.</p> <p>N. 1°13'30" E., across sec. 18, T. 39 N., R. 27 E., on a blank line.</p> <p>Over mountainous land, covered with medium sagebrush, scattered shadscale, cacti, Brigham tea and native grass.</p>
1.50	Wash, 5 lks. wide, 1/2 ft. deep, drains NE.
10.80	Spur, slopes ENE.
16.10	Wash, 5 lks. wide, 1/2 ft. deep, drains ENE.
20.515	Intersect the E-W center line of the SW ¹ / ₄ of sec. 18, T. 39 N., R. 27 E., at a point from which the point for the S ¹ / ₁₆ sec. cor. of sec. 18 as described in the field notes of T. 39 N., R. 27 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears N. 88°41'50" W., 0.347 chs. dist.
30.344	The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 13, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 39 N., R. 26 E., executed under Public Land Survey No. 269. Add the marks "T39N R26E R27E 1997" to the brass cap.
