CHAINS	<p>From this corner, the amended monument for the <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. of sec. 1, T. 39 N., R. 26 E., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set showing 14 ins. above ground, with a mound of stone, W. of cor., with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of T. 39 N., R. 26 E., executed concurrently under this same Group, bears S. <math>89^{\circ}54'10''</math> E., 2.812 chs. dist.</p>
27.20	Spur, slopes E.
40.884	<p>Point for the <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor. of sec. 6, at proportionate distance, based on the survey executed in 1873; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, <math>2\frac{1}{2}</math> ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock, over a plastic-encased magnet and in a collar of stone, 3 ft. base to top, with brass cap mkd.</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> <p>T39N R26E R27E   <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S 6</p> <p>1997</p> </div>
52.60	Paiute Creek, 8 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, courses irregularly ESE.

81.768	<p>The cor. of Tps. 39 and 40 E., Rs. 26 and 27 E., monumented with a volcanic stone, 19x11x7 ins., mkd. with 6 grooves on the S. and E. faces, firmly set in a mound of stone.
