Deputy Surveyors D.H. Barker and E.C. McClellan in 1879,
and a Portion of the Dependent Resurvey Executed by
Cadastral Surveyor A.D. Griffin in 1963-65.

From the cor. of secs. 31 and 32 only, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.,
monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set,
projecting 20 ins. above the ground, in a collar of stone, with
brass cap erroneously mkd.

From this cor., National Geodetic Survey control (formerly U.S.C.

206.431 chs. dist., monumented with a standard U.S.C. & G.S. disk,
3 1/2 ins. diam., firmly cemented in a drill hole in bedrock,
with top mkd. SMITH 1954.

S. 88°57'50" W., on the S. bdy. of sec. 31.
