CHAINS	Deposit the iron pipe inside the stainless steel post.
	N. 0°34'20" W., beginning new measurement.
5.029	The center S-N 1/64 sec. cor. of sec. 6, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., projecting 2 ins. above the ground, with metal tag mkd. RE 807. This monument was set by Jack K. Leavitt in 1961 as shown on Record of Survey, File 10, Page 46, on file in the office of the Clark County Recorder and is accepted as a careful and faithful determination of the corner position.
	N. 0°42'30" W., beginning new measurement.
5.029	The center N-S-N 1/256 sec. cor. of sec. 6, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., projecting 2 ins. above the ground, with metal tag mkd. RE 807. This monument was set by Jack K. Leavitt in 1961 as shown on Record of Survey, File 10, Page 46, on file in the office of the Clark County Recorder and is accepted as a careful and faithful determination of the corner position.
	N. 0°46'20" W., beginning new measurement.
5.042	The center N 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 6, monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., set in a mound of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1957 resurvey.
	N. 0°47'10" W., beginning new measurement.
11.494	The center N-N 1/64 sec. cor. of sec. 6, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., projecting 2 ins. above the ground, no cap. This is accepted as a careful and faithful determination of the corner position.
	N. 0°47'10" W., beginning new measurement.
11.530	The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 6 only, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., set in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1957 resurvey.
	From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 6.
	N. 85°35'00" W., on the E-W center line of sec. 6.
21.444	The center E 1/16 sec. cor. of sec. 6, monumented with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., projecting 8 ins. above the ground, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the 1957 resurvey.
