The area can be reached from Goldfield by traveling southerly on U.S. Highway No. 95, thence westerly on Nevada State Route No. 266. Numerous graveled and dirt roads provide access to the area.</p> <p>The terrain varies from nearly level to mountainous. The elevation ranges from about 5700 feet to about 9000 feet above sea level. The soil is sandy clay loam and gravel. The vegetation consists of pine, cacti, sagebrush and native grasses.</p> <hr/>
