primarily limited to recreational uses such as four wheel drive vehicles, motorbikes, ATV's, mountain bikes, and hikers. The Mt. Rose Wilderness boundary follows along the west boundary of

section 31 and a portion of the westerly half of section 30. Vegetation consists of pine, fir and mountain mahogany, sagebrush, buck brush, manzanita, and native grass. Recent forest and brush fires have burned portions of the foothills.
