GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this survey are located in Lincoln County, Nevada, about 30 miles southeast of the community of Alamo, Nevada. Access is gained by way of U.S. Highway No. 93.

Kane Springs Wash drains southwesterly through the township. Coyote Springs Valley runs northerly and southerly through the area surveyed. The average elevation of the area surveyed is approximately 2500 feet above sea level.

No apparent mineral activity was noted in the area during this survey.
