<p>CHAINS</p> <p>26.10</p> <p>40.777</p> <p>80.745</p>	<p>Trail road, 20 lks. wide, bears SE. and NW.</p> <p>The center 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 26.</p> <p>The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 26 and 27, monumented with the bottom portion of an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, broken off flush with the ground, with brass cap and top portion of iron post laying nearby, mkd. as described in the field notes of the survey of T. 15 N., R. 26 E., executed under Group No. 22.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over plastic-encased magnet, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T15N R26E 1/4 S27 S26 2006</p> <p>Deposit the top and bottom portions of the iron post alongside the stainless steel post and set a steel fence post alongside.</p> <hr/> <p style="text-align: center;">GENERAL DESCRIPTION</p> <p>The area resurveyed within Township 15 North, Range 26 East is gently rolling to nearly level bottom land. The elevation ranges from 4300 to 4500 ft. above sea level. The soil ranges from sandy clay loam to rocks and sand. The vegetation consists of sagebrush and bunchgrass to meadow land along the Walker River which flows easterly through the area.</p> <p>The area is used by ranchers for cattle grazing.</p> <p>There are no apparent mineral formations in the area.</p> <hr/>
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
