## TOWNSHIP 13 NORTH, RANGE 28 EAST, MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA CHAINS General Description The area encompassed in this survey is rolling open lands in the northeast portion of the township, mountainous in the southwest portion and developed rural and urban lands in the central portion. The elevation ranges from about 4150 feet to 7400 feet above sea level. Walker River runs through sections 4, 9, 15, 22, 23, 26, 35 and 36. Vegetation consists of pinyon pine in the upper elevations, sparse juniper near the summit of Black Mountain, cotton wood trees and willows along the Walker River, with sagebrush inthe upper elevations transitioning to shadescale at the lower elevations. Grasses are bunch and cheat grass. Evidence of mining activity and abandoned mining claims exist throughout the western most sections. The lands surrounding the Walker River are predominantly agricultural. A canal system, originating at Weber Reservoir, located 1 mile north of the township, delivers water throughout the nearby community. The soil consists of loam deposits generated from the Wassuck Range to the west and volcanic hills to the north, with sediments deposited from the Walker River. Access is via U.S. Highway No. 95, on the east side of the township, U.S. Highway No. 95 Alternate, traversing northwest thorough the center of the township, and by numerous improved roads and trails in the area. The town of Schurz, Nevada is located in the southwest portion of the township, approximately 25 miles east of the town of Yerington, Nevada.
