This point now becomes an amended position.</p> <p>POINT NOT MONUMENTED</p> <hr/> <p>N. 89°46'50" W., across sec. 35, T. 40 N., R. 31 E., on a blank line.</p> <p>Over hills, through sagebrush and native grasses.</p>
6.00	Ridge, bears N. and S.
40.928	<p>The Garside 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, monumented with a trap stone, 12x8x5 ins., firmly set flush with the surface of the ground, mkd. 1/4 on N. face. Garside in 1874</p> <hr/> <p>From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a brass tablet, 3 1/4 ins. diam., firmly set in a boulder, 36 ins. x 12 ins., projecting 18 ins. above the ground, with top mkd. as described in the field notes of the 2001-04 dependent resurvey of the N. bdy. of T. 38 N., R. 31 E., executed concurrently under Group No. 802.</p> <p>N. 2°09'10" E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.</p> <p>Over flats, through sagebrush and native grasses.</p>
3.00	Louse Creek, 20 lks. wide, course SE.
31.80	Dry creek, 10 lks. wide, drains SE.
36.227	<p>The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with a trap stone, 10x9x5 ins., firmly set 6 ins. in the ground, mkd. 1/4 on W. face.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, with brass cap mkd.</p>
