<p>From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11, determined at a depression within a scattered mound of stone, with an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 28 ins. long, lying loose on the ground alongside, with brass cap mkd. as described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of a portion of the subdivisional lines, T. 15 N., R. 65 E., executed under Group No. 524.</p>	
<p>At the corner point</p>	
<p>Reset the iron post, 25 ins. in the ground and add the marks 2014 to brass cap.</p>	
<p>N. 4°21'00" E., bet. secs. 2 and 3.</p>
