	GENERAL DESCRIPTION
	The area surveyed lies in the northerly extremes of the Pahranagat Valley. The terrain varies from mountainous in the east portion to nearly level in the central portion with the remaining terrain being gently rolling. The elevation ranges from about 3,900 to 5,200 ft. above sea level. The soil varie from sandy clay loam and rocky on the higher elevations to cla loam on the bottom land. The native vegetation is primarily sagebrush. A portion of the bottom lands are currently irrigat croplands.
	The surveyed area is located approximately two miles northeast of the community of Hiko, Nevada. This historical community wonce the county seat of Lincoln County. Today all that remain are a cemetery, a stone building and a small number of homes.
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
