
Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by
U.S. Mineral Surveyor William T. Olmstead in 1911

Mohawk lode

From Cor. No. 1, Mineral Survey No. 3962, Mohawk lode, identical with Cor. No. 2, Mineral Survey No. 3962, Daisy lode, on line 3-4, Mineral Survey No. 3971, Golden Chariot No. 1 lode, determined at the center of a mound of stone, 4 ft. diam., 1 ft. high, with a wood post, 4x4x36 ins., lying loose on the mound, faintly mkd. D2 on a side and M1 on the opposite side. This mound of stone correlates well with other existing corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, and in a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

Bury wood post alongside stainless steel post.

From this corner, Cor. No. 4, Mineral Survey No. 3971, Golden Chariot No. 1 lode, hereinafter described, bears S. 58°51'00" W., 8.559 chs. dist.

N. 58°51'00" E., on line 1-2, Mineral Survey No. 3962, Mohawk lode, identical with a portion of line 4-3, Mineral Survey No. 3971, Golden Chariot No. 1 lode.

8.10 Trail road, 15 lks. wide, bears SE. and NW.

8.459 Cor. No. 2, Mineral Survey No. 3962, Mohawk lode, identical with Cor. No. 1, Mineral Survey No. 3962, Last Chance lode, on line 3-4, Mineral Survey No. 3971, Golden Chariot No. 1 lode, determined at the center of a mound of stone, 6 ft. diam., 1 ft. high, with a wood post, 4x4x30 ins., lying loose on the mound, faintly mkd. 3962 on a side and M2 on the adjacent side. This mound of stone correlates well with other existing corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 23 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, and in a mound of stone, 6 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.
