


DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF PORTIONS OF MINERAL SURVEY NO. 100,

MS51 G COR1 MS100 M T16N R21E S5 COR5 PLS10836, 2012, as recorded in Storey County, Nevada, File No. 117835. Not utilized in the course of this survey.



Chonta claim on the Front Comstock Ledge

From the point for Cor. No. 1, Mineral Survey No. 117, Chonta claim, on line 8-1, Mineral Survey No. 48, Justice and Independent claim, determined at record distance from Cor. No. 3, Mineral Survey No. 117, Chonta claim; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set a stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 23 ins. in the ground, over a plastic-encased magnet, and in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.
