<p>CHAINS 40.875</p>	<p>The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, determined at the base of a steel fence post, lying loose on the ground, set by Survey Technician J.R. Munson, as shown on the Cadastral Survey Corner Card, dated April 14, 1961. There is no remaining evidence of the original cedar post. This position correlates well with existing original corners and is accepted as the best available evidence of the position of the original corner.
