	<p>Reestablishment of a Portion of the Survey Executed by U.S. Deputy Surveyors T.A. Magee and M.F. Riley in 1881</p> <hr/> <p>Beginning at the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., determined in a depression at the center of an embedded mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., 1 ft. high, with the remains of a wooden post lying loose alongside.
