

Retracement of the E. bdy. T30N. R45E.

Chains

- 9.30 Shallow wash bears NE.
- 38.35 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
Land mountainous, Soil rocky 4th rate
North 64 chs drains NE, South 15 chs drains SW
Heavy sage brush.
- Oct 28: at the above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I set off
13° 6' S on the decl. arc; and at 11 h. 44 m.
l.m.t. observe the sun on the meridian; the
resulting lat. is 40° 25'.
- 41.16 West on a random line bet. secs 24 and 25
Fall 7 lks. S. of old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which cor. is
a granite stone 6x5x4 ins. above ground and
marked and witnessed as described by the
Surveyor General. The old pits are almost
obliterated. I raise a mound of stone
2 ft. base 1½ ft. high N of cor.
Thence I run
S 89° 54' E on a true line bet. secs 24 and 25
Desc. gradually.
- 2.00 Draw course north; asc. gradually
- 19.10 Top of ridge bears N and S. desc;
- 41.16 The cor. of secs 24 and 25.
From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
West on a random line bet. secs 24 and 25
- 38.17 The cor. of secs 23, 24, 25 and 26. which
cor. is a basalt stone 20x10x8 ins. set firmly
in mound of stone, and marked and witnessed
as described by the Surveyor General. I remark
the cor. 2 notches on S and 1 notch on E edge.
and rebuild the mound around the cor.
Thence I run,
East on a true line bet. secs 24 and 25
Asc. very steep west slope of high mountain
- 35.20 Top of ridge bears N 10° W and S 10° E desc. gradually,
- 38.17 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
