Chains

General Description

Surface mostly hilly & broken by ridges & ravines,

Soil stoney

Very fine Nut Pine timber on the South boundary of Sec. 36, from which the Settlers in Grass Valley obtain a portion of their supply of fuel and timber

The stream which crosses the South Boundary of Sec. 35 has its source in the mountains to the South East and runs North Westly into Grass Valley, at present it affords but a small amount of water which sinks and rises alternately; along this stream there is just rate land for cultivation from 11.5 chains in width, a portion of which is located and improved

- 40.00 Set a granite stone 30 x 15 x 8 for 1/4 Sec. Cor from which  
 A Nut Pine 6 inches in dia. bears N 56° E. 85 yds dist.  
 A Nut Pine 6 in dia bears N. 87 1/2° W. 173 " dist.  
 as per instructions 16.15 East
- 54.25 Foot of steep wooded Slope x cañon runs N. N. W.  
 and ascend moderately steep slope of ridge
- 68.60 A Nut Pine 6 in dia
- 80.00 Set a Granite stone 20 x 7 x 5 for standard cor  
 to sections 31 & 32 from which
