

TOWNSITE SURVEY NO. 1.

Feet

Thence South 35 chains to F. S. M. No. 8,  
 Thence West 5 chains to F. S. M. No. 9,  
 Thence South 10 chains to F. S. M. No. 10,  
 Thence East, 5 chains to F. S. M. No. 11,  
 Thence South 15 chains to F. S. M. No. 1, the place of  
 beginning.

As my survey of this townsite is to be in conformity with  
 the Forest Service survey thereof, I first retrace the  
 lines as run by the Forest Service.

April 30: I go to Forest Service Monument No. 3, which  
 has been reestablished by Mr. William Strover, U. S.  
 Surveyor, as Jarbidge Townsite Survey cor. No. 3. I  
 find the same to be a rhyolite stone, 9 x 11 x 8 ins.  
 above a mound of stone, mkd. with a cross (x) on top,  
 JTS on NW., and 3 on SE. face; from which

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 59° W., 68 ft. dist.,  
 mkd. JTS 3 BT;

with a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 3 ft. high, NW. of  
 the cor.

At 10h. 30m. a. m., 1. m. t., I set off 41° 52' on the  
 lat. arc and 14° 41' N. on the decl. arc, and determine  
 a meridian with the solar at this cor. No. 3. Thence  
 I retrace

West, on line 2-3.

660.0 After diligent search I find no trace of F. S. M. No. 2.  
 I set a temp. cor. for Jarbidge Townsite Survey cor.  
 No. 2.

Thence I retrace

North, on line 1-2.

660.0 To a point, from which F. S. M. No. 1 bears N. 6° 41' E.,  
 138.4 ft. dist., the same being a round, wooden post, 3  
 ins. diam., 42 ins. above ground, mkd. with pencil FSM  
 ¼ mile of sec. cor.

Therefore the true position of Jarbidge Townsite Survey  
 cor. No. 2 relative to my temp. cor. is N. 6° 41' E.,  
 69.2 ft., the dist. being found by the following pro-  
 portion: The dist. between temp. cor. No. 2 and the
