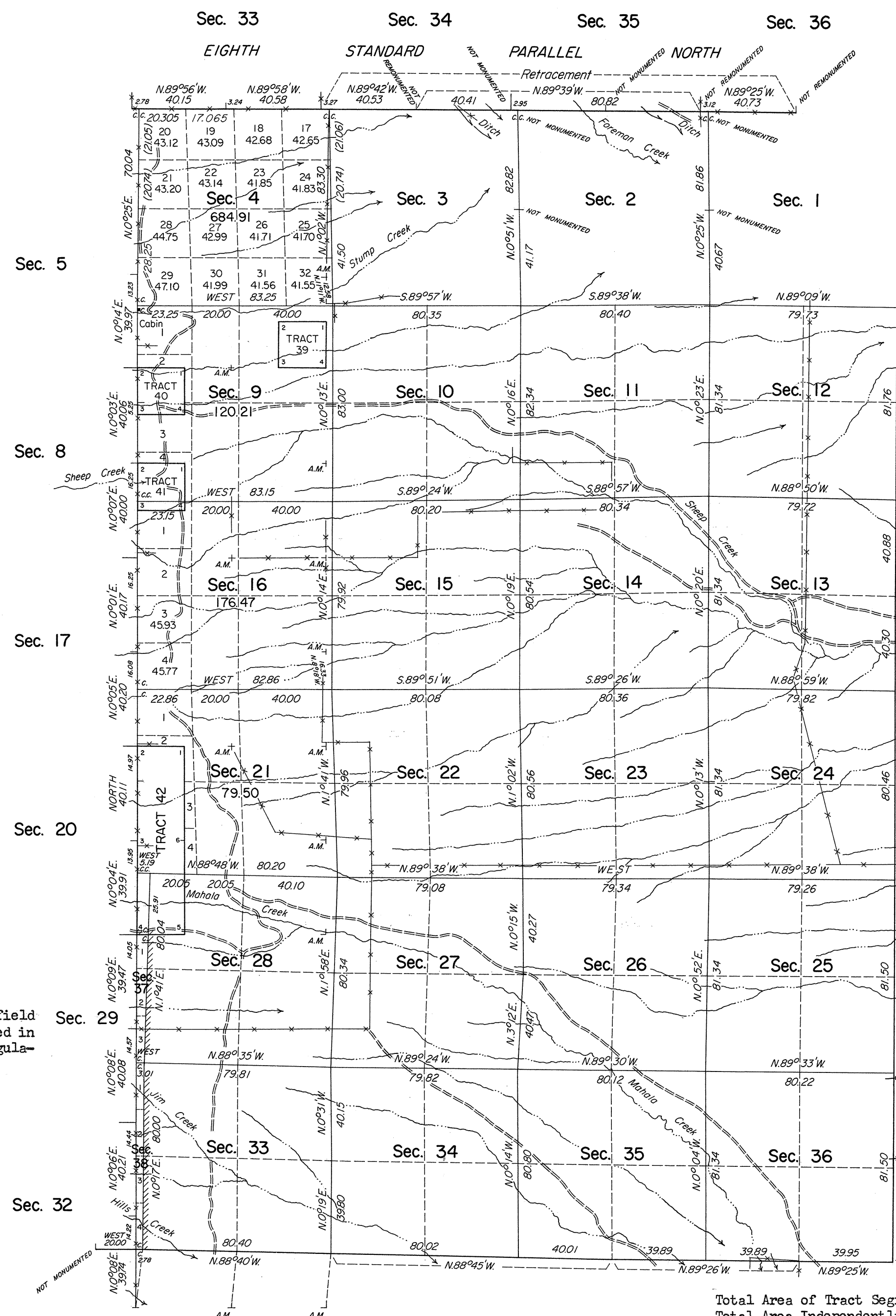


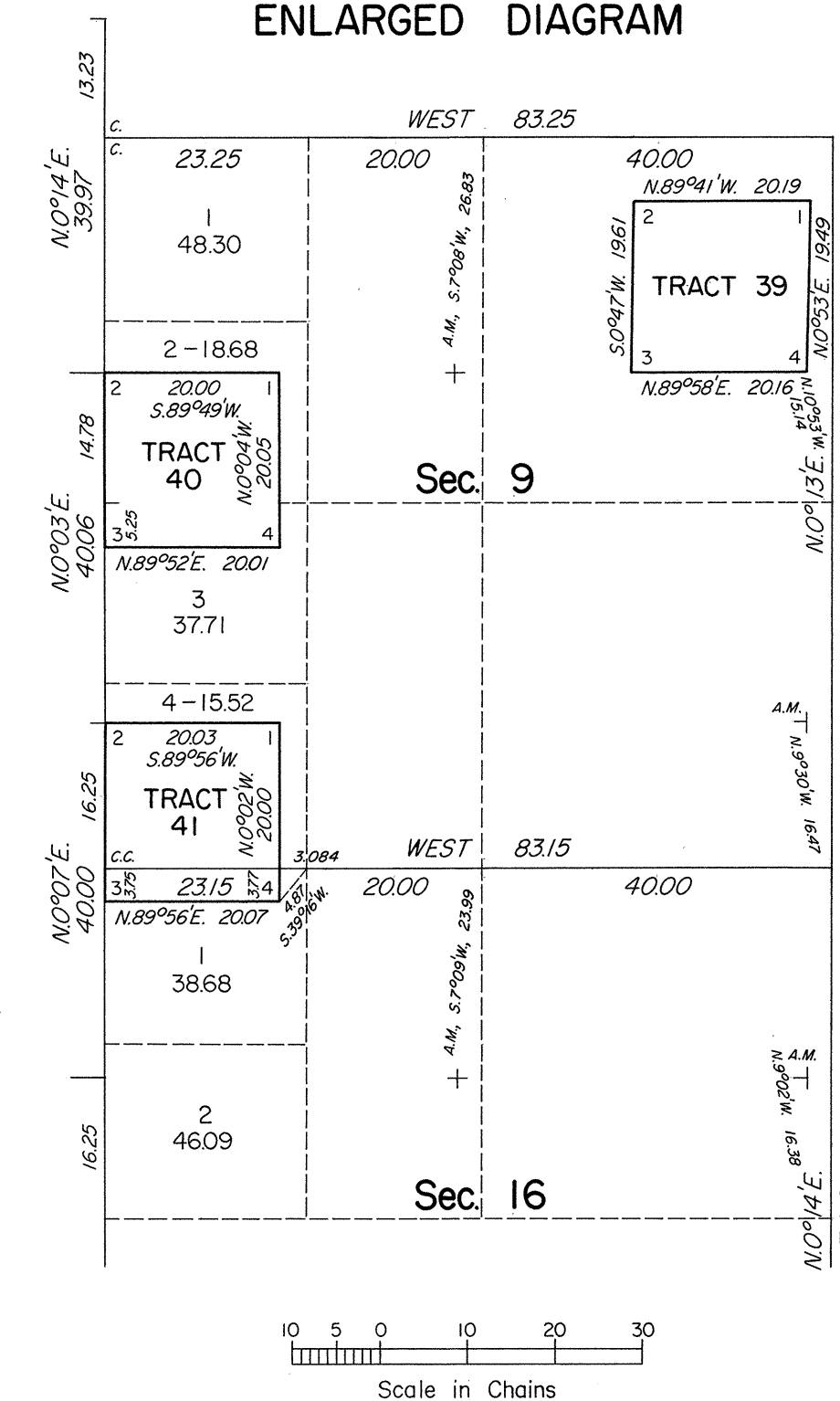
TOWNSHIP 40 NORTH, RANGE 54 EAST, OF THE MOUNT DIABLO MERIDIAN, NEVADA

A history of surveys is contained in the field notes.

This plat, in two sheets, represents a retracement and dependent resurvey of the Eighth Standard Parallel North, through a portion of R. 54 E., and a dependent resurvey of a portion of the south and east boundaries of T. 40 N., R. 54 E., designed to restore the corners in their true original locations according to the best available evidence; an independent resurvey of portions of sections 4, 9, 16 and 21, that supersedes, so far, as the public lands are concerned (hereon indicated by new subdivisional lines, lottings and areas) all such similar units that are shown upon the plat approved April 6, 1901, the survey of sections 37 and 38, and the metes and bounds survey of Tracts 39, 40, 41 and 42.

Lottings and areas, except as shown hereon, are as shown on the plat approved February 25, 1871.

Survey executed by Eldon W. Sibley, Cadastral Surveyor, May 15, 1963 to April 23, 1976, under Special Instructions dated March 4, 1963, and Supplemental Special Instructions dated July 25, 1967 and March 26, 1976, for Group No. 404, Nevada.
